Faith Statement

- We believe the Bible is God breathed, inspired by the Holy Spirit and the absolute Word of God. Deuteronomy 4:2, Psalm 19:7-9, Proverbs 30:5-6; 1 Corinthians 2:10; Galatians 1:6-10; II Timothy 3:16-17; II Peter 1:20-21.
- We believe that there is one God, a Holy Trinity, eternally existent in three persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Genesis 1:1-3; Matthew 28:19-20; Mark 12:29; John 1:1-4; II Corinthians 13:14.
- 3. We believe in God the Father. We believe He is the creator of all, perfect in holiness, wisdom, power and love. We believe that He concerns Himself sovereignly in the affairs of each person, that He hears and answers prayer, and that He saves from sin and death all who come to Him through Jesus Christ. Genesis 21:33; Exodus 33:14; II Samuel 24:14; Isaiah 40:28; Jeremiah 31:3, 32:17, 33:3; Romans 5:8 and 11:33-34; Ephesians 1:19-20; Hebrews 4:16; I John 5:14-15; Revelations 4:8.
- 4. We believe in God the Son, Jesus Christ the Savior. We believe in His virgin birth, in His sinless life, in His miracles, in His substitutionary and atoning death through His shed blood, in His bodily resurrection, in His ascension to the right hand of the Father, in His continuous intercession for His people, and in His personal return with power and great glory. Matthew 24:30; Luke 1: 34-35; John 1: 1- 2, 14, 3:16; Romans 3:23-26, 8:34-39; I Corinthians 15:3-4; Hebrews 4:14-15.
- 5. We believe in God the Holy Spirit, the Helper and Comforter. We believe in His daily guidance and revelation of truth, in His conviction of sin, and in His indwelling presence at the moment of salvation, enabling believers to live godly lives. John 3:5-8, 4:24, 14:16-17, 16:13-14; Acts 1:8, I Corinthians 2:6-16, 12:13; Ephesians 4:30-32, 5:18.
- 6. We believe that everyone is born with a sinful nature, separated from God and in need of salvation. Rebirth by the Holy Spirit is absolutely essential for salvation through the repentance from sin and the acceptance of Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior. John 3:5-8, 5:24; Acts 2:21; Ephesians 1:6-7, 2:8-9; Titus 3:5; I Peter 1:23.
- We believe in the resurrection of both the saved and the lost; the saved unto the resurrection of eternal life and the lost unto the resurrection of eternal death. Luke 16:19-26; II Corinthians 5:8; II Thessalonians 1:7-9; Revelation 20:11-15.
- 8. We believe in the spiritual unity of believers in our Lord Jesus Christ. Matthew 28:19; Acts 2:42-47; Romans 15:5-6; I Corinthians 11:23-26; 12:13; Hebrews 10:25.

**Curriculum and instruction at ACS are grounded upon and bound by the Holy Scriptures (distinctly Christian) and reflect a Reformed worldview, as it is interpreted in the doctrinal standards of the Reformed faith.

Positional Statement on the Teaching of Human Sexuality at ACS

In a culture where sexuality is central to many conversations and controversies, we feel that it is important that Allendale Christian explain the position we hold on how human sexuality is seen and taught (where appropriate) within the school setting. Through all of the conversations, we see all people as image bearers of God, and we are called to love our neighbor as ourselves.

1. Image Bearers and Sexuality

- We believe God created all things good. God also created all people in His image. Sexuality, as part of the creation, was given as a gift to Adam and Eve (Genesis 1:26-27).
- We believe that God wonderfully and immutably creates each person as male and female. These two distinct, complementary genders together reflect the image and nature of God (Genesis 1:26-27).
- God's design for sexual expression, as stated in scripture, was intended between a man and a woman in the context of marriage (Genesis 2:22-24; Proverbs 5:18-19; Matthew 19:4-6; Mark 10:6-9; I Corinthians 7:1-9).

2. <u>The Impact of the Fall on Image Bearers and Sexuality</u>

- No image bearer is exempt from the fall. Every aspect of creation was affected by humanity's fall into sin (Romans 3:23, 5:12).
- The brokenness that resulted from the fall affected all of humanity in many ways, including sexuality and all human relationships. In our brokenness, humans have expressed their sexuality in ways that fall outside of God's original design (Leviticus 18:22, 20:10,13; Matthew 5:28; Romans 1:26-27).
- Despite this fact, Christians are called to a life that glorifies God (Leviticus 18:22; Matthew 6:33-34; I Corinthians 6:18-20; Ephesians 5:3; Hebrews 13:4).

3. <u>Redemption of the Image Bearer</u>

- Though sinful by nature, all Christians are granted grace and forgiveness through Christ (Matthew 26:28; Romans 6:23, 7:24-25; Ephesians 2:8-10).
- As a response for the grace and forgiveness given by God, Christian people are called to love their neighbors as themselves (Matthew 22:39; Ephesians 5:1-2; Philippians 2:1-5).
- Every person must be afforded compassion, love, kindness, respect, and dignity. (Mark 12:28-31; Luke 6:31.) Hateful and harassing behavior or attitudes directed toward any individual will not be tolerated and are not in accord with Scripture nor the policies of ACS.
